

## Religious Education

The children will be learning about Humanism and exploring how all people, religious or not, can learn from Humanist ideas. They will learn about the key beliefs held by Humanists and the principles that guide their approach to life.

## Physical Education



In outdoor PE, the students will be playing handball.  
For indoor PE, we will be doing gymnastics.

## English



We will be reading *On the Move* in Destination Reader, where children will explore poems related to migration. In writing, we will use *Windrush Child* as a stimulus to explore Jamaican history through writing a letter, a diary entry, and a persuasive pitch to the local council.  
**Spelling:** Rules related to suffixes and Year 6 Spelling Bee words.  
**Grammar:** Modal verbs, dashes for extra information, relative clauses, adverbs, the subjunctive form, semi-colons, and formal/informal tone.

## Maths



We will use the Maths - No Problem approach, which enables children to develop fluency and reasoning skills.

This half-term, we will cover the following topics:

**Fractions, Decimals, Measurement, and Word Problems.**

There will also be weekly arithmetic lessons to prepare for the end-of-KS2 tests.

**Arithmetic:** The children will bring home any arithmetic tests that they did in class. Help your child with any operations they are struggling with.

## Music



The students will learn to play the keyboard, aiming to identify notes correctly and use both their left and right hands to play with increasing confidence. In addition, they will be learning to read and write treble clef notation with increasing fluency.

## Geography



We will be exploring the reasons why populations change over time and vary between different regions. Children will learn about the main causes of migration and the factors that influence people to move between countries. They will also explore the impact of climate change on the global population.

## Science



This term in science, children will be studying light and reflection. They will learn about different sources of light and how light travels. They will also investigate how shadows are formed and what factors can affect their size. The children will record their findings in a variety of ways, including drawing diagrams and creating line graphs, before making conclusions.

## PSHE
