We will continue to learn Maths through the Maths No Problem approach which enables children to develop number sense and reasoning skills. We will use this Concrete-Pictorial-Abstract approach to build a solid foundation for conceptual understanding. We will be moving on from addition and subtraction and we will be concentrating on mental and written methods for multiplication and division.

Art



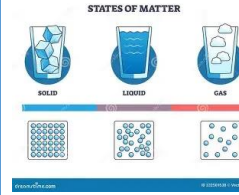
This half term we will be learning about painting and mixed media. We will be focussing on lightness and darkness and looking at different ways of producing each.

Physical Education



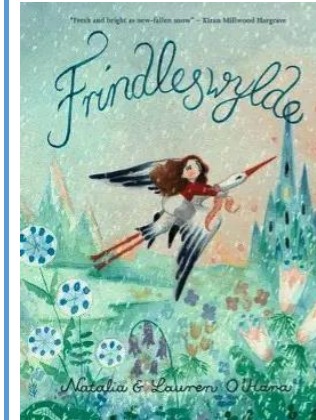
On a Thursdays both classes will be exploring a range of outdoor challenge games with Mr Holland. On Friday, Elder class will explore dynamic balance to agility through jumping and Pine class will be swimming.

Science



We are looking at materials and states of matter. This topic will look at solids, liquids and gasses and the properties of each. It will also focus on the processes that transform materials from one state to another.

English



The children will be reading Frindleswylde by Natalie and Lauren O'Hara. Their writing will focus on descriptive writing, using adjectives and adverbs. At the end of the unit they will write their own narrative based on the text.

Religious Education

In this unit pupils will reflect on the lessons that may be learned from significant people within religious and non-religious traditions.

History



This half term, Year 4 will be learning about the Anglo-Saxon invasion in Britain. They will be learning about who the Anglo-Saxons were and the impact of this invasion on Britain.
