Learning in Year 1

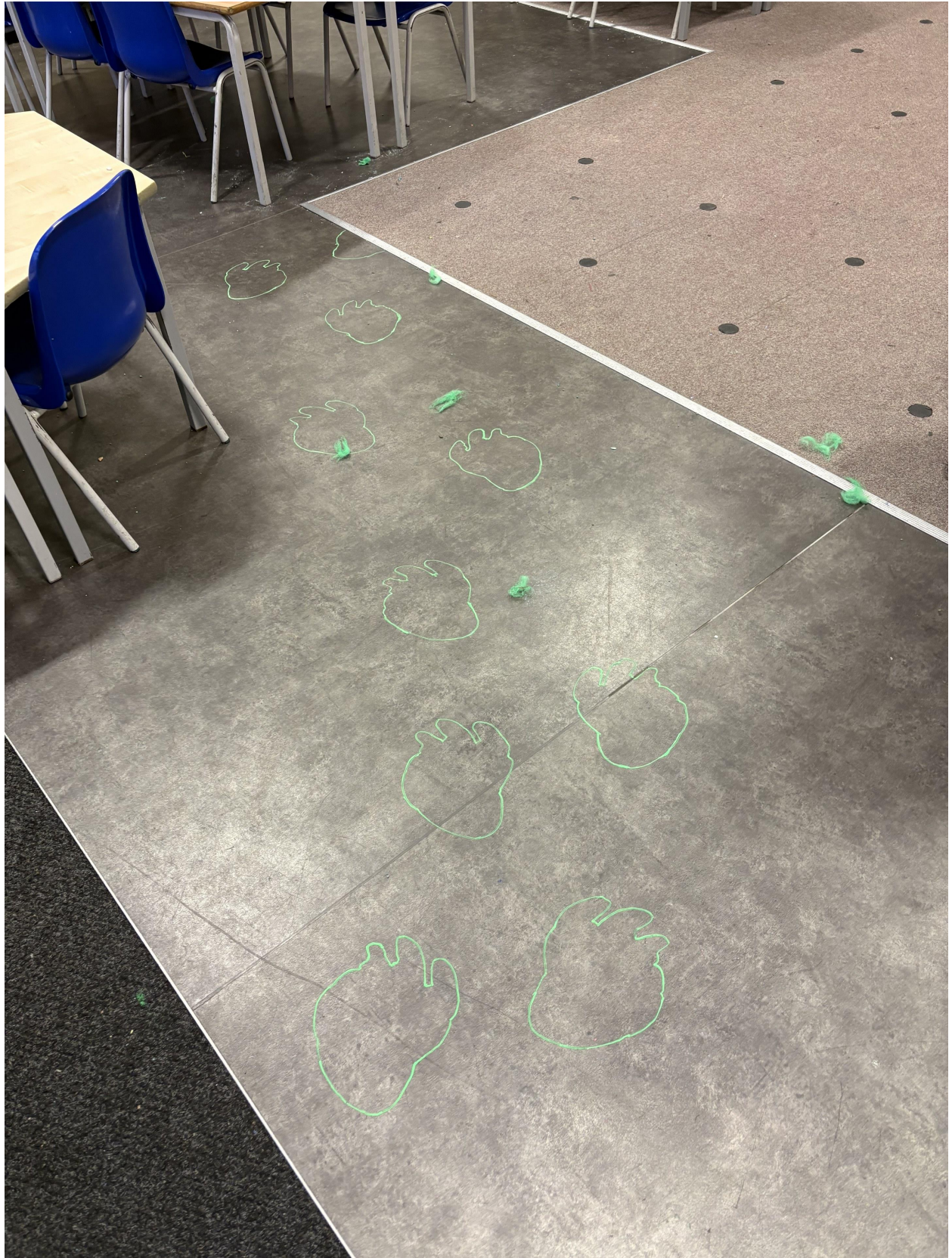
Year 1 have made a fantastic start to the year and have jumped straight into their learning with enthusiasm and curiosity!

In English, the children were intrigued by a mysterious and frightening beast that had been spotted in school. They asked brilliant questions and discovered a new hero who helped to save animals in the woods. Inspired by this, the children are now busy writing their own imaginative versions of the story. In science, we have been exploring our senses and this week focused on taste. The children bravely sampled a range of foods and described them with descriptive words

such as bitter and sour. Sam said 'I loved the lime even though it was sour, I wanted to eat more.' We were especially amazed by how many children enjoyed tasting limes!

DT lessons have been full of creativity as the children began learning how to make hand puppets. They explored different ways to join materials together, and some children have already created their very own finger puppets. Lorentz said, 'I cut little squares to add to the main body to make it look like a creeper'. In history, the children loved having Mrs Croyden with us and exploring some of her childhood toys. They asked thoughtful questions about what the toys were made from and why they were special, helping them to learn more about life in the past. In computing, we have been improving our mouse skills and making repeated patterns on sketch.io. Valentino and Viyan said, 'we liked making the pattern it was nice to see different cars.' Year 1 have shown wonderful enthusiasm across all areas of learning — keep up the good work!

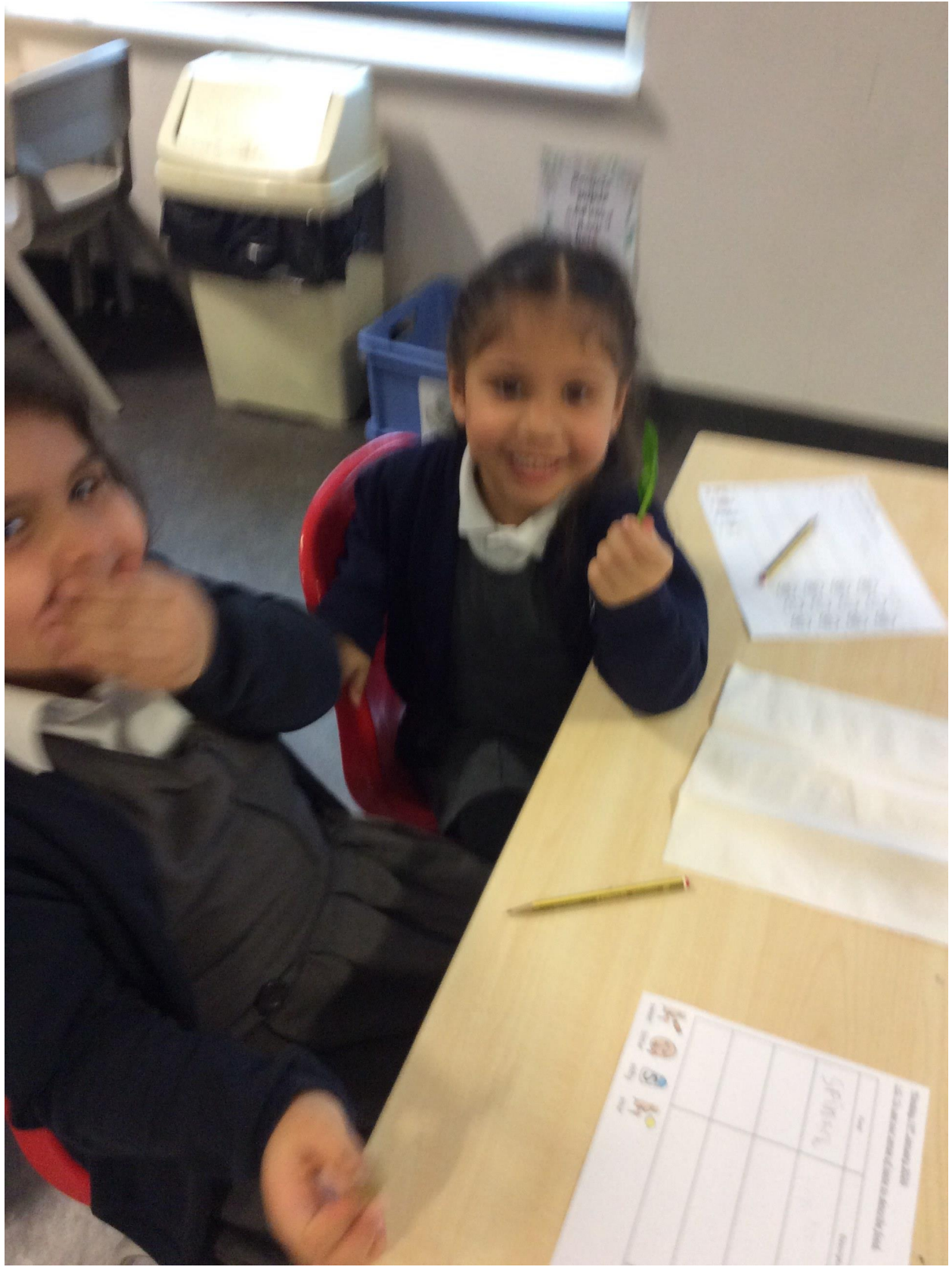

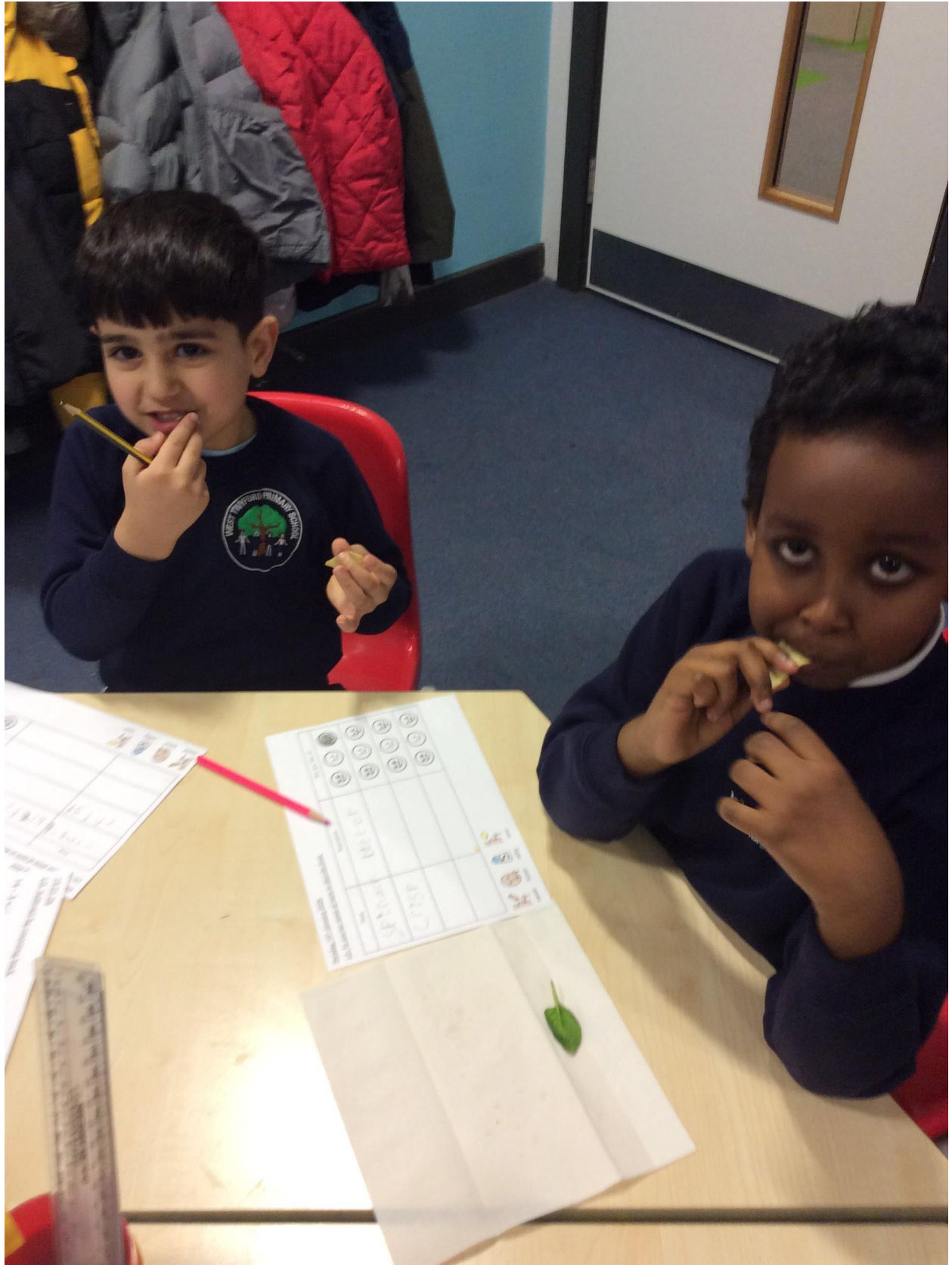
