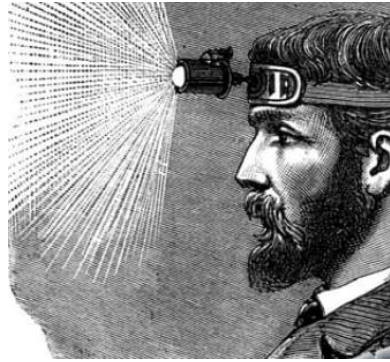


Summer 1 focuses on developing

understanding of time, decimals, and measurement. Pupils read and convert time, use decimal notation, and measure length, mass, and volume accurately. They solve practical problems, make comparisons, and apply skills in real-life contexts, building confidence, fluency, and reasoning across all areas of learning.

Children will be taking their Multiplication Tables Check in June where they will be asked 25 questions. They will be revising for this important test.

Art & Design



Pupils will identify electrical products and explain their uses, support the construction of a working switch, and understand how a torch functions. They will design and create a torch that meets given success criteria, evaluating its effectiveness and ensuring it includes a working switch.

Physical Education



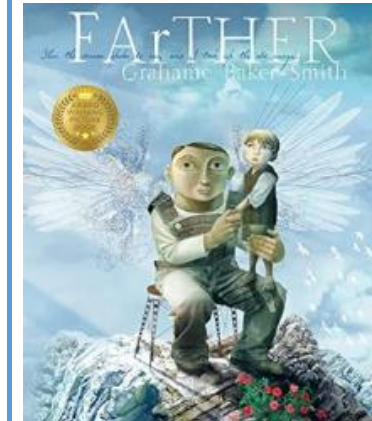

Science



Summer 1 focuses on grouping and classifying living things based on their characteristics. Pupils explore a range of habitats and understand how environments can change over time. They consider how these changes affect plants and animals, developing skills in observation, comparison, and scientific enquiry.

Trip

The next trip is tbc.

Pupils will understand the key periods, beliefs, cities, and decline of the Ancient Maya civilisation, including how they lived in the rainforest and what was happening in Britain at the same time. They will also use historical skills to make deductions and recognise the role of historians and archaeologists in understanding the past.

French



Children will learn to understand and respond to spoken and written descriptions of hobbies and pastimes. They will write short, simple sentences using a noun and an adjective and identify and use masculine and feminine forms of some adjectives.

Music



Children will continue to learn to play the ukulele. They will learn to create different rhythms using open strings, they will be introduced to single fingered chords and will continue to use the fret position to change the pitch of a note.

PSHE



Summer 1 focuses on understanding money, value, and future choices. Pupils explore what makes something good value for money, track spending, and learn how to keep money safe. They also consider influences on career choices, reasons for job changes, and how to challenge stereotypes and make informed decisions.

How parents can support at home:

Reading: Ensure your children reads **every day** for 20 minutes and fills in their Reading Record. The reading record must be brought to school every day.

Spelling: Help your child learn the spelling rules and their spelling words.
