Children will be learning about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. Children will use timelines to order events, explore archaeological evidence to learn how prehistoric people lived and compare settlements.

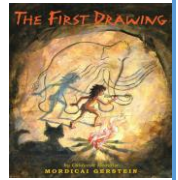
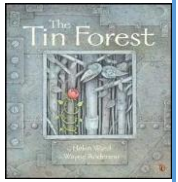
Science
