Our focus in writing is to build longer sentences using conjunctions (and, but, because, etc.).	Art  In Art, we will be exploring how artists use tone and texture in observational drawings. We will learn how to make choices about which materials and techniques to use to create an effect.	Physical Education We will be focusing on the fundamental skills of balancing, running, changing direction, jumping, hopping and skipping in our indoor lessons. We will use equipment outdoors to practice our sending and receiving skills including throwing and catching, rolling, kicking, tracking and stopping a ball. 	Science Our topic is 'Habitats'. We will be learning about plants and animals in a range of habitats. We will also be observing the variations between different habitats, how animals are adapted to live in them and deepen their understanding about food chains.	History The children will investigate 'How was school different in the past?'. We will be learning how historians use primary sources to learn about the past. The children will be developing their investigation skills by comparing features of a classroom now and a classroom 100 years ago.
