

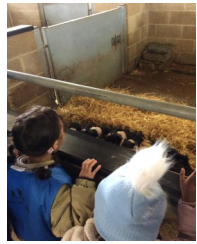

## Mixing Classes Consultation

We are considering mixing up year groups for next year and we would like to have your views on this. This would mean that for September we would change which children were in which class for the new year (September 2024). As we only have 2 classes in each year group, children would be with some of the same children (about half) and some from the other class. We are considering this because there are some advantages:

- It can help with behaviour issues in the class
- It helps children to learn to work with a wider range of children
- It helps to balance the different children in each class (especially when new children have arrived)
- It helps children learn to be in different groups which they will have to do in secondary school

Any new classes would be carefully planned, and we would aim to have children with at least some of their friends. They would continue to have playtime with the whole year group so would be able to play with children from both classes. Please let us know your views about this.
